Hythe U11s played at St Margaret's on Sunday and **won by 37 runs!!**

Batting first, Hythe posted a total of **304** with our hosts only reaching **267** in pursuit of what was a very good score.

There were some good knocks by Hythe players:

Tom scored 17 runs, including 3 fours in a row and **Sam** added a useful 11.

Our top scorer on his debut for the club was **Jack** who scored 18 runs in a very good last pair partnership with **Max**

We only lost 5 wickets throughout our innings which helped us to post such a good score.

Our bowling and fielding were excellent!

Well done to **Max** for volunteering to keep wicket. We conceded very few byes and your glove work was very neat, including a very close stumping attempt.
