Match report:

The U11 team played Folkestone A at Cheriton Rd on Sunday 24/5/09 and lost by 36 runs.



Hythe fielded first and the first thing to comment on was the superb improvement In the bowling. We gave away far fewer wides and no balls.

This, plus some accurate line and length bowling from everybody, restricted Folkestone to a score of 289.

Leading the way again was Dillon with 2 wickets with Jamie and Theo picking up a wicket each. Sam bowled a very lean spell conceding only 8 runs from his 3 overs. Tom, Max and Harry also bowled well without picking up a wicket. Max once again took on the responsibility of bowling the last over which is the only over when wides or no balls have to be rebowled.

The fielding was on the whole very good, with some good throwing in, particularly Tom and Sam who threw in well from the boundary. Euan gave another excellent display wearing the gloves, especially on the leg side, with only 2 byes getting passed him and a couple of quick thinking attempts to stump batsmen.

There were a few misfields and I would remind you all to get down low when fielding the ball with your knee on the floor using your lower leg as a barrier to stop the ball incase you miss it with your hands. I would much rather send you to the pavilion for an ice pack for your bruised shin with you having stopped the ball than signal a four after a mis-field! It would be good to hear a little more noise whilst you are in the field, clapping good balls and encouraging the bowler.

Our batting again progressed steadily but no one was able to really get going against what was an excellent bowling performance by Folkestone. Jamie, Harry and Sam all top scored with 7 each. Tom and Max showed some good aggression but were unable to get going. Dillon persevered for an unbeaten 5.

Whilst I was umpiring I noticed that several of our batsmen did not take a guard when arriving at the crease. It is important to do this as the mark you make lets you know where your stumps are and therefore enables you to judge if a ball is going wide or hitting the stumps. if you are not sure how to ask for a guard ask me at coaching on Sunday and I will show you. Also try to remember to run your bats in to the crease when taking singles as we nearly lost a couple of wickets to run outs. Again, for those of you that don't understand this I will demonstrate at coaching.

In all another good performance against a strong side.
